Andrew Prime, project coordinator, has recently completed the final report of the Little River Project. This was the largest revegetation effort ever undertaken by our Landcare group with superb support, both in terms of funding and expertise, from Melbourne Water, Vision for Werribee Plains, CMA and the Commonwealth Government.

Among the highlights of the program:

- eight landowners actively involved
- approximately 15,000 trees and grasses planted
- 15km of Little River frontage fenced off
- project expenditure \$283,000

Note that the mulching trees and shrubs, either at time of planting or subsequently vastly increases growth rates and optimizes the chance of survival through the hot Balliang Summer.
