Brisbane Ranges Landcare Group Meeting

1. Speaker: Colin Cook

Phascogales, Dunnarts and friends: finding indigenous wildlife around Balliang! Fauna Surveys using camera "trapping".

Have you ever wondered what lives in the hollows of those magnificent remnant gum trees?

Many of our native animals are small, shy creatures and mainly nocturnal so are rarely seen in daylight. We really know very little about their distribution or habits.

However there are two interesting projects underway in our area aiming to find some answers. One project is collecting and analysing "scats" (poo) from predators such as cats and foxes to determine what they are eating in different areas.

The other is an ambitious project by the Friends of the Brisbane Ranges group to use motion sensing cameras to determine where marsupials are located and to install nest boxes with cameras to monitor their movements.

Come to the meeting to hear about the findings of these projects, and discuss the possibility of doing similar work in our area.

Colin Cook has many years' experience with fauna surveys with the Friends of Brisbane Ranges and the Geelong Field Naturalists Club. He has been successful developing camera equipment for use on this project. The motion-sensing cameras can also be used for:

- recording native fauna, both in the bush and revegetated areas
- tracking feral animals
- identifying the culprits causing damage to tree plantings etc.
- observing users of nest boxes, dams, burrows, bird feeders etc.

Find out how these cameras work, the preliminary findings of the project and some tips and tricks to improve monitoring success.
