Stuart was born in Bacchus East Primary Schooll, went on to the Bacchus Marsh High School and then finished schooling at St Pats, Ballarat. He has grown up on, and now owns, the property - on the Bacchus Marsh Road - called 'Elanstan'. His parents - you guessed it - were Ellen and Stan.

Stan and his brother Gordon were World War 1 Veterans Stan was sent to the Middle East and was involved in the charge of the Light Horse at Bethsheba. Gordon was at the Gallipoli landing. After the war they both obtained Soldier Settlement land grants of 160 acres each. Their properties were opposite each other. Eventually Stuart bought into one with further purchases along the way.

Stuart and Denise were married Marsh. He attended the Balliang in 1967. Stuart tells the story of meeting Denise, a Bacchus Marsh girl, at the many balls they both attended. Those were Stuart has seen many droughts the davs!! They have three children, Kathy, Debbie and Tony, and they have one grandchild. Tony now works on the farm which is cropping and sheep.

> Stuart has done many and varied work in his time. He has worked in shearing sheds. He operated a business delivering fuel and spreading super for about 20 years. The busiest Stuart was during this time was

when the Bacchus Marsh bypass was being constructed. He also did contract harvesting. drove a stock transport truck and a Tournapull (a large excavator) at the Cairn Curran 'Mountview' and combined them reservoir and at the coal mine in Winsleydale, out of Winchelsea. Stuart was the Captain of the Balliang Fire Brigade for 16 years and he is still involved as a volunteer. His main interests are his family and the property.
